## Text-Based Intervention – Narrative Scoring Chart

### Definitions

- **Literal Question:** A question that has a specific answer and that is clearly stated in the text. (*What did the character wear?*)
- **Interpretation Question:** A question which asks about something that is implied or hinted at in the text. (*Why was the mother angry?*)
- **Inference Question:** A question that does not rely on textual information. The reader must draw on world and word knowledge, and problem solving abilities to answer well. (*Was the character really angry or just playing? Would you be angry in the same situation?*)
