Definitions

- **Literal Question:** A question that has a specific answer and that is clearly stated in the text. (What did the character wear?)
- **Interpretation Question:** A question which asks about something that is implied or hinted at in the text. (Why was the mother angry?)
- **Inference Question:** A question that does not rely on textual information. The reader must draw on world and word knowledge, and problem solving abilities to answer well. (Was the character really angry or just playing? Would you be angry in the same situation?)
