# Synthetic Phonics – Word Completion Activities: CCVCC Words and CCCVC Words

#### Word list for completion...

drank, grand, plank, crank, slump, spend, spent, swept, drink, print, stink, swift, twist, blond, clump, grunt, clump, stump, scrap, split, scrub, strip, strap, spring, string, scruff

Each of the target words is a CCVC or CCCVC word. That is, each word has five sounds, four are **consonant** sounds (C), and one is a **vowel** sound (V). In these activities the vowels are all *short* vowels – a i o e u - and are consistently the same sound when spelling.


#### **Directions**


- Your child's task is to write the missing letters/graphemes in each box.

- Cover completed words before starting the exercises.




#### <u>Tips</u>


- Cover the target words.
- Encourage your child to sound out the sounds while writing the letters.
- Feedback for errors, i.e. your child writes **spedn** for **spend**. Say, 'The /n/ sound comes right after the /e/ sound s...p...e...n...d,' (together) Point to your child's incorrect **n** spelling. 'What do you need to do?'





















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
