Text Based Intervention Syntax (Compound Complex Sentences)

Compound-Complex Sentence

Definition: a compound – complex sentence contains at least 2 **main** clauses and one or more **subordinate** clauses.

Main Clause: the main clause makes a statement and is a complete thought. It can be an independent sentence.

Subordinate Clause: cannot stand alone; is incomplete.
Dependent on the main clause. Introduced by a subordinating word, such as: when, which, as, because, etc.

Compound-Complex Sentence - Example

As I put my coat on, I looked out the window, but I couldn't see any rain.

Subordinate Clause Main Clause Conjunction Main Clause

As I put my coat on I looked out the window but I couldn't see any rain

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
